**Subject:- Grant of Yearly Permission to JR's Tantia Shri Ganganagar College of Ayurvedic Science & Hospital, Near RIICO, Hanumangarh Road, Sri Ganganagar-335002, Rajasthan (Inst. ID AYU0228) with intake capacity of 60 seats in UG (BAMS) course and 15 seats in 03 PG courses in the subjects namely (i) Rachna Sharir-05 seats, (ii) Dravyaguna Vigyana-05 seats, (iii) Swasthavritta-05 seats for the academic session 2025-26 under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 reg.**

Sir/Madam,

- To assess the available facilities of teaching, non-teaching, hospital staff, practical training and other infrastructure facilities at your college namely **JR's Tantia Shri Ganganagar College of Ayurvedic Science & Hospital, Near RIICO, Hanumangarh Road, Sri Ganganagar-335002, Rajasthan (Inst. ID AYU0228)** inspection was conducted on **15.04.2025 and 16.04.2025 in hybrid mode** as a part of annual visitation by the visitation team of Medical Assessment and Rating Board, NCISM to process **the permission with intake capacity of 60 seats in UG (BAMS) course and 15 seats in 03 PG courses in the subjects namely (i) Rachna Sharir-05 seats, (ii) Dravyaguna Vigyana-05 seats, (iii) Swasthavritta-05 seats for the academic session 2025-26 under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020.**
- The visitation report and all other related documents were assessed in terms of enforced regulations namely the Minimum Essential Standards, Assessment and Rating for Undergraduate Ayurveda colleges and Attached Teaching Hospitals Regulations, 2024", provisions under the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant regulations thereunder. **On careful examination of the assessment report following shortcomings/defects have been observed:-**

**1. Herbal Garden:-**

- Number of species is 175 with a shortcoming of 75 thereby not fulfilling the criteria as per concerned regulation.

**2. Teaching staffs:-**

- Availability of total teaching staff for UG (BAMS) Course as per the part-1 submitted by the college is

The assessment report was duly placed in the 139<sup>th</sup> Board meeting of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM) convened on 06.08.2025 and Board observed that the college is not fulfilling the notified & requisite criteria for issuance of permission as per the concerned acts and regulations but is fulfilling the criteria in accordance with the Board's policy letter issued on 09.01.2025 & 20.01.2025. Further, the Board also observed that the college is not fulfilling the criteria for extended permission in accordance with regulation 54(2) of MESAR UG Ayurveda regulations 2024 as the college was acted upon by the Board under section 28(1)(f) of NCISM Act 2020, Hon'ble High Court vide order dated 10.10.2024 permitted the college to provisionally admit the 60 students for the academic session 2024-25. Hence, the Board decided to issue yearly permission with intake capacity of 60 seats in UG (BAMS) Course in accordance with regulation 54 (3) of Minimum Essential Standards, Assessment and Rating UG Ayurveda regulations, 2024, under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 for the academic session 2025-26.

**"DECISION"**

4. Therefore, JR's Tantia Shri Ganganagar College of Ayurvedic Science & Hospital, Near RIICO, Hanumangarh Road, Sri Ganganagar-335002, Rajasthan (Inst. ID AYU0228) is hereby granted with Yearly Permission with intake capacity of 60 seats in UG (BAMS) course in accordance with Regulation 54 (3) of Minimum Essential Standards, Assessment and Rating UG Ayurveda 2024 and 15 seats in 03 PG courses in the subjects namely (i) Rachna Sharir-05 seats, (ii) Dravyaguna Vigyana-05 seats, (iii) Swasthavritta-05 seats in accordance with Regulation 15(7) of NCISM (Minimum Essential Standards, Assessment and Rating for Postgraduate Institutions and Minimum Standards for Postgraduate Education in Ayurveda) Regulation, 2024 for the academic session 2025-26, under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 subject to the condition that aforementioned shortcoming shall be fulfilled along with the following condition:-
- I. It is further informed that minimum **15% of undergraduate seats of the permitted intake capacity of 60 seats and minimum 15% of postgraduate seats of the permitted intake capacity of 15 seats in 03 PG courses** shall be treated as all India quota. The counseling for seats under all India quota shall be conducted by respective counseling authority as designated by Central Government for A.Y. 2025-26 and counseling for the remaining 85% seats or as the case may be, shall be conducted by the concerned Counseling Authority of that State/UT. **The permission of the college stands withdrawn if the college fails to comply with the aforesaid direction of the Central Government/NCISM for all India quota or the students admitted thereunder.**
  - II. It is also informed that determination of fee and all other charges in respect of 50% of seats in private Medical Institutions and deemed to be University should be as per the guidelines issued by NCISM vide ref no. BUSS/Fee/ASU/2022-23 dated 16.09.2022. Fees of the remaining 50% of seats are to be fixed as per the guidelines of Fee Fixation/Regulatory Committee (FRC) of respective State/UT/Deemed to be University.
5. Admissions made in violation of the above conditions will be treated as invalid and action will be initiated under NCISM Act & Regulations thereunder.
6. Further, **as per Sub-section (7) of Section 29 of NCISM Act, 2020**, The Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine may conduct evaluation and assessment of any University or medical institution at any time, either directly or through any other expert, having integrity and experience in medical profession, without any prior notice and assess and evaluate the performance, standards and benchmarks of such University or medical institution and if the college is found to be not maintaining the Minimum Essential standards as specified in the concerned Acts & Regulations then **in accordance of Section 28 (1) (f) of NCISM Act, 2020 the issued permission of the college shall deemed to be withdrawn and denial of permission shall be issued by MABISM for stoppage of admission for that particular academic year or the subsequent year.**
7. Discrepancies, if any, may be immediately brought to the notice of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine, NCISM.

8. Further, a penalty of Rs. 1 crore was imposed on your college vide MARBISM's letter and due to the shortcomings, a denial letter for academic year 2024-25 was issued to your college by MARBISM on 27.08.2024. However, you approached before the Hon'ble High Court of Rajasthan at Jodhpur & filed W.P No. 15004 of 2024, wherein Hon'ble Court vide its interim order allowed your college to provisionally admit students for Academic Year 2024-25 & matter is Sub-Judice before Hon'ble Court. Therefore, the remaining pending amount of Rs. 1 Crore is subject to final outcome of writ petitions pending before Hon'ble High Court of Rajasthan at Jodhpur.
9. You are hereby instructed to comply with all the requirements of Aadhaar Enabled Biometric Attendance System as mentioned in the Implementation letters vide. ref. no. 3/2024/MARB/AEBAS & HMS. Dated 09.05.2024 & 06.09.2024 issued by the Board.
10. The following requirements must be fulfilled and the compliance report must reach the Board by 31<sup>st</sup> December, 2025 to be considered for the issuance of permission for the academic session 2026-2027:-
- All the requirements under the provisions of the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant Regulations made thereunder should be fulfilled.
  - All the requirements of Minimum Standard of infrastructure and teaching & training facilities as specified in NCISM (Minimum essential standards, assessment and rating for undergraduate Ayurveda colleges and attached teaching hospitals) Regulations, 2024.
  - All the requirements of Minimum Standard of infrastructure and teaching & training facilities as specified in NCISM (Minimum Essential Standards, Assessment and Rating for Postgraduate Institutions and Minimum Standards for Postgraduate Education in Ayurveda) Regulations, 2024.
  - All the requirements of Minimum Standard of infrastructure and teaching & training facilities as specified in NCISM (Minimum Essential Standards, Assessment and Rating for Postgraduate Institutions and Minimum Standards for Postgraduate Education in Ayurveda) Regulations, 2024.
  - All the requirements of the National Commission for Indian System of Medicine (Minimum Standards of Undergraduate Ayurveda Education) Regulations-2022.
  - The shortcoming mentioned in Para no. 2 above, shall be fulfilled.
11. The fulfillment of the conditions given above may be made within the time period specified and compliance report should be submitted by the college within the timeline as mentioned above to the President, Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine. The Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine will verify that the conditions have been fulfilled for considering the permission for the academic session 2026-27.
